In particular, this includes the development and preparation of Levelling Up Fund second round competitive bids and UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) Investment Plans, 2022–25, based on predetermined local authority UKSPF allocations; both within extremely tight timescales.

As we’re now entering the summer holiday period, I hope colleagues across all 32 local authorities have an opportunity to have a well-earned break.

## Arrol Gibb Innovation Campus Aims to Transform Large-scale Manufacturing

A global centre of excellence aiming to transform large-scale manufacturing through innovation and skills development has been launched in Fife. Based at [Babcock International's Rosyth facility](#), the Arrol Gibb Innovation Campus (AGIC) will serve a range of small to medium-sized enterprises in the marine, nuclear and energy-transition sectors, offering access to the latest industrial techniques and technology, industrial and office space, innovation advice and skills development.

AGIC is a collaboration between [Babcock International](#), [The University of Edinburgh](#), [University of Strathclyde](#), [Fife College](#), [Fife Council](#), [Scottish Enterprise](#) and [Skills Development Scotland](#). The partners are developing leading expertise in five core capabilities on one site: large-scale advanced manufacturing, composites, robotics, nuclear manufacturing, and digital shipbuilding. These five are supported by cross-campus skills development and an Innovation Incubator for start-up businesses and existing businesses looking to engage in innovative product and process improvements.

A key element of AGIC's offering is skills development, for clients, as a standalone service for businesses, and for apprentices and students in schools, colleges and universities. AGIC will offer access to real-life datasets and state-of-the-art equipment, including the latest digital and data tools, plus world-leading academic research and the latest shop-floor developments.

## New Jobs and New Opportunities as Levenmouth Business Park Gets Funding Boost

New modern and attractive business units, which will create and sustain jobs in the Levenmouth area, have moved a step closer – courtesy of funding from the Levenmouth Reconnected Programme (LRP). Almost £715,000 has been allocated from the LRP's £10 million fund to bolster what's available at Levenmouth Business Park, with seven new employment units – comprising an incredible 753m<sup>2</sup> of business space – being developed in a prime location.



Around 25 jobs are expected to be created as a direct result of the new units, while construction itself is estimated to create at least 26 additional jobs. Councillor Craik, Spokesperson for Finance, Economy and Strategic Planning, said:

"The award of funding from Levenmouth Reconnected is welcomed and Fife Council's Economic Development Team looks forward to supporting further investment and economic benefits as the rail project progresses."

Located less than a mile from the proposed Cameron Bridge rail station, the new Business Park also provides opportunity

serve to encourage higher patronage at that location by modes such as foot, wheeling, cycle, or bus.



## £105 gift cards for around 85,000 Glasgow households to be issued

Glasgow City Council has approved the distribution of Covid Low-Income Gift Cards worth £105 to around 85,000 low-income households in the city. These cards can be used in registered businesses in Glasgow, with more than 700 businesses of all sizes registered across the city so far, and almost 400 small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in the process of registering.

The council was given £9.456million by the Scottish Government for this project - from the Scotland Loves Local campaign - with this funding coming from the Scottish Government's £80million Covid Recovery Fund. The Scotland Loves Local campaign looks to encourage people in Scotland to think local first and support businesses on their local high streets.

Councillor Susan Aitken, Leader of Glasgow City Council, said: "The gift cards will give city businesses a much-needed lift following two years of the pandemic and the resulting impact on trade. But they also allow us to support tens of thousands of low-income households and individuals with practical assistance, something we hope can make a positive difference to them during the worst cost-of-living crisis in decades."

## UK's Premier Facility is a Reality in Ayr

A state-of-the-art Extended Reality (XR) facility, regarded as the leading XR showcase in the UK, has been officially opened by Minister for Business, Trade, Tourism and Enterprise, Ivan McKee MSP in Ayr. The Aerospace Digital Visualisation Suite (ADVS) gives small or medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) free access to the very latest XR and digital visualisation technologies to help them grow their business in the aerospace and space sector. The ADVS facility was established following a successful bid to the Advancing Manufacturing Challenge Fund, led by South Ayrshire Council and its partners.

Offering an unrivalled suite of technology and equipment, the ADVS enables engineering companies to innovate, develop skills and improve their productivity. Ivan McKee MSP commented: "Through the ADVS, South Ayrshire will play a key role in supporting high growth Small and Medium sized Enterprises (SMEs), along with development of the sector, which are critical to achieving our National Strategy for Economic Transformation ambitions."

Councillor Martin Dowe, Leader of South Ayrshire Council said: "South Ayrshire is home to Scotland's largest aerospace hub at Prestwick, which is receiving a great deal of interest due to the £80 million investment from the Ayrshire Growth Deal to establish new



cutting-edge technology to improve their productivity and competitiveness.”

## North East Scotland Green Freeport – Delivering the Net Zero Capital of Europe

On June 20th, the North East Scotland Green Freeport (NESGF) consortium submitted its formal bid for Green Freeport status. A freeport is a special economic zone surrounding an air, rail or sea port or collection of ports that offers tax breaks and lower business tariffs. This helps to stimulate the local economy and create inclusive, prosperous communities.

NESGF encompasses Aberdeen City and Peterhead and aims to deliver growth and regeneration in the North East of Scotland and transform the region into a global leader of sustainable energy and innovation.

Up to 32,000 high-quality jobs will be created under NESGF’s ground-breaking plans to transform the region into the 'Net Zero Capital of Europe'. If the bid is successful, NESGF will secure vital trade and support the acceleration of innovation, diversification and decarbonisation of the region's key sectors and deliver a £8.5 billion GVA boost, ushering in a new era of investment, innovation, regional regeneration and opportunities for those that need them most.

NESGF is a collaborative consortium formed by Port of Aberdeen, Aberdeen International Airport, Peterhead Port Authority, Aberdeen City Council and Aberdeenshire Council joining forces with industry and academia to drive forward a successful bid.

Exclusive to members of Midlothian Tourism Forum, this collaborative event connects businesses and offers access to dedicated support from Midlothian's Economic Development and Business Gateway teams. Sessions focus on challenges facing the sector from the business perspective, identifying creative solutions and opportunities to increase visitor numbers and benefit local tourism businesses.

### Social Enterprise Conversation Sessions

With partner Midlothian Third Sector Interface, communities in Midlothian are brought together to make real change. Sessions are designed to be open forums for attendees to

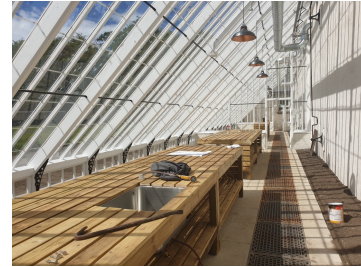

## Grow @ The Vinery

The Vinery is a brand-new community space in the coastal town of Banff, Aberdeenshire, which has been restored and regenerated with help from the Scottish Government, Aberdeenshire Council and the lead provider chosen as local charity Aberdeen Foyer. Its main aim is to alleviate the impact of poverty and provide support to individuals by working alongside them to move towards and sustain employment. Therapeutic sessions are provided, which utilise the fantastic indoor and outdoor space, to help people improve their health and wellbeing through mindfulness, exercise, training, and accredited learning.



Targeting the long-term unemployed to deliver the vinery objectives has been a key recruitment strategy. The team have been working with the council & Job Centres and five people have already been recruited to the Long Term Unemployment scheme, with three more identified to join. Roles include a chef, gardener, community engagement officer, general assistant, and digital and media assistant.

Clare Bancroft - Project Lead for The Vinery said: "It's fantastic to see everything coming together and the hard work of The Foyer, Aberdeenshire council and our community groups finally realised. We're also so proud our new team members who have put a huge amount of effort into training for their new roles."

A sold-out conference saw a number of Scotland's space industry experts present the benefits of the burgeoning space cluster in Prestwick to an audience of more than 110 delegates. The *Beyond Launch* event showcased the opportunities that adding space supply chain activity to an already established aerospace cluster will bring to Ayrshire and the local economy, including the creation of thousands of new jobs.

Programme Director of Prestwick Spaceport, Mick O'Connor, said: "The development of the space cluster at Prestwick with the Spaceport as the flagship further advances the UK's space industry, which is now one of the country's fastest growing

## Tay Country Launches Dedicated Online Resource For Travel Trade

Scotland’s Tay Country, comprising Angus, Dundee, Fife and Perthshire, have created a dedicated travel trade channel with new itineraries, content and images to assist the travel trade wishing to develop programmes and itineraries in the region. There are four new itineraries targeting different potential visitor groups which weave together themes of golf, cultural exploration, food and drink, adventurous activities, relaxation and new experiences. All trips include businesses which are ready to partner with tour operators, DMCs and travel agents wanting to develop programmes in Scotland.



Tay Country aims to increase overall visitor spend into the region to £550 million by 2024. While the region’s businesses engage actively with inbound tour operators, this need for growth and development warranted the creation of further sales assets to enable better support for the travel trade. Born out of the Tay Cities Growth deal, which brought together the four areas, Scottish Enterprise and VisitScotland, Scotland’s Tay Country epitomises the Scottish Government’s focus on regional partnerships and collaborations. To succeed in its regional growth targets, the return of international visitors and the involvement of the travel trade play a key role.

## North Ayrshire Community Benefits Wish List

Since launching in October 2021, North Ayrshire Council’s Community Benefits Wish List has successfully matched over 20 Council contractors (and counting!) with local groups looking for support.

Developed in partnership with the local Third Sector Interface, the initiative has seen local community and Third Sector

community benefit agreement with Ayrshire business Fergusons Bakery (a Scotland Excel contractor) has enabled the food larder network to offer their members freshly baked rolls twice a week, greatly improving the dignity and quality of their affordable food offer. The process has also enabled groups access support for more complex projects, such as new paving in community gardens; on two occasions two contractors have co-delivered support, with one donating slabs and the other donating staff time.

Groups looking for support can register up to three 'wishes' on the publicly accessible list, and Council contractors then review the needs and identify those they are best placed to support. The Wish List supports the Council's Community Wealth Building agenda by increasing the value of procurement within North Ayrshire, and makes community benefits accessible and visible to the grassroots organisations who are creating change in their communities.

## Moray Pathways Employability Support and Training Hub – 1 year celebration of achievements

The Moray Pathways local employability partnership are celebrating 1 year since the Moray Pathways Employability and Training hub was opened in June 2021. The hub was initially set up to target young people who have been hardest hit by the pandemic to access the support and opportunities they need. Funding from DWP and the local employability partnership was secured to employ a core team of staff from Moray Council Employability Team. The team involves a DWP Youth Work Coach who provides benefit advice and support, a project officer to co-ordinate the project and a project officer (digital inclusion) to provide vital digital support and develop digital skills.



The project quickly expanded to support people of all ages, with an increased number of partners using the hub to meet with clients and deliver training and employability support. Kailie Walsh, Hub Project Officer from Moray Council, is proud of what the hub has become. "Despite lockdowns, restrictions and challenges along the way, nearly 500 people from across Moray have used a variety of hub provisions to improve their employability in the widest sense – A range of partners have delivered over 200 sessions, from large employer recruitment days to 1:1 sessions, and marketplaces showcasing the variety of support partners can offer, whether that be learning/training, digital, wellbeing or financial."
